Text of the Catechism – Fourth Commandment

Honor (beyond obedience)

Father, Mother – foundation of all authority, foundation for all mankind

- Distinct from others we are only commanded to love others, honor is more (we honor because of the authority behind them)
- Honor [attitude] modesty, humility, submission, [works] provide for them in their need, must not forget them [ESPECIALLY when they are old]
- NO BETTER WORK AMONG MEN
- This includes all who stand in the place of our parents ([HOME] grandparents, foster, step, teachers, bosses [Church] pastors, SS teachers, youth leaders, etc. [State] Government officials)
- Good examples Joseph (respected Jacob), Ruth (served Naomi),
 Samuel (obeyed his mother, obedient pupil), Isaac (obeyed Abraham),

Despise, anger

- Absalom (2 Sam 15:1-14)
- Esau unkind, cause grief, stubborn, disobedient, talk back

Situation in the world is directly related to this Commandment

- If people followed it, the world would be more peaceful, safe, etc.

First Commandment with a promise

- That you may live long
- Reward happy, fortunate days
- Punishment die sooner, not enjoy life
- Not just long life, but health, wife, children, livelihood, peace, good government etc.
- Disobedient live bad lives filled with problems

Fathers by blood vs. Fathers by office

- "Other authorities"
- Government
 - o Acts 4 obedience to God more than this
- Pastors

Jesus Kept the Fourth Commandment (active obedience)

- Luke 2:51 He obeyed his parents
- Makes provision for Mary even while dying
- Respected the office of the priests of his day

- Obedience to the government of His day, paying taxes, submitted to unjust rulers.
