- 2019 Lenten Season** ~ Lent begins today. This year's Lenten theme will be on the Ten Commandments. Copies of the devotional for Lent "Lent with the Lord's Commands" are available now in the narthex.

Why Do We Use Ashes?

The use of ashes is a poignant symbol for repentance and mortality throughout Scripture. "I repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:6b). "For dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The imposition of ashes has been therefore a fitting beginning to the season of Lent. Although ashes remind us of the Law and the subsequent consequences for our disobedience, ashes also remind us of the Gospel - as they are applied in the shape of a cross - the place where Jesus conquered sin, death, hell and Satan.

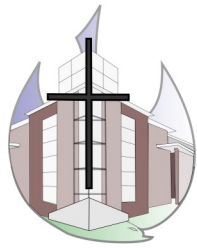
