Why Do We Use Ashes?

The use of ashes is a poignant symbol for repentance and mortality throughout Scripture. "I repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:6b). "For dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The imposition of ashes has been therefore a fitting beginning to the season of Lent. Although ashes remind us of the Law and the subsequent consequences for our disobedience, ashes also remind us of the Gospel - as they are applied in the shape of a cross - the place where Jesus conquered sin, death, hell and Satan.
